CITC 1 AWARD NAME

CITC 1.1 The University offers the Certificate in Information Technology and Computing. Holders of this award are permitted to use the letters Cert IT & Comp (Open) after their names.

CITC 1.2 Approval has been given for this qualification to be withdrawn. The final date on which it will be awarded is 31 December 2012.

CITC 2 REGISTRATION

CITC 2.1 To register as a student, you must satisfy Student Regulation OU 8. There is no academic entry requirement.

CITC 2.2 To be awarded the certificate, you must ensure that your credit is linked to it. You can do this as part of the registration process or make a separate request later.

CITC 3 CREDIT REQUIREMENT

CITC 3.1 To be awarded the qualification, you must obtain a minimum of 60 credits by the successful completion of the specified modules.

CITC 3.2 The credit for this qualification must include from Open University or collaborative scheme modules a minimum amount of credit that meets the conditions of Student Regulation OU 3.3; that minimum is 20 credits.

CITC 4 CREDIT TRANSFER

CITC 4.1 There is no credit transfer scheme for the certificate.

CITC 5 DURATION OF STUDY

CITC 5.1 The credit required for the Certificate in Information Technology and Computing must be obtained during the time that the qualification is available. Modules do not need to be studied consecutively.

CITC 5.2 Credit from any and all modules ceases to be countable towards the Certificate in Information Technology and Computing three years after their final presentation.
