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1.0 KEY APPLICANT INFORMATION

Welcome to The Open University's Skill Up, Flexible Skills Fund guidance notes for our Autumn 2024 offering.

1.1 Residential eligibility criteria



- To be eligible for a fully funded place you must be domiciled in Northern Ireland
- eligible to work in Northern Ireland
- settled in Northern Ireland, and ordinarily resident in the UK for at least three years or have indefinite leave to enter or remain in the UK
- over 18 years of age

Please note as part of the application process and entry requirements stipulated by the Department for the Economy, you will be asked to provide proof of residential status in Northern Ireland. We are required to verify residential status for every round of funding. All applicants are required to provide this with every application.

1.2 Further eligibility

For this presentation, we have a limited number of funded places available. Please review the eligibility requirements for the module you wish to apply for.

1.3 Shortlisting criteria

The panel when assessing applications will consider the following:

- The overall quality and strength of the application and supporting statement.
 The panel will assess educational background, professional background and evidence of how funding will aid career and/or personal development.
- Academic achievement on previous Open University postgraduate modules and/or microcredentials. Assessment scores and examinable scores (where available) will be taken into consideration.
- Where applicable how applicants meet their chosen module entry requirements.

The decision of the panel is final.

1.4 Making an application.



Please note that to be considered for a fully funded place, an application form must be completed via the application form on the Skill-Up webpage: https://www.open.ac.uk/courses/choose/skill-up

Complete the application form for the module that you would like to apply for. The application form is available from: <u>The Open University | Courses and Qualifications</u> under "**How to Apply**".

Whilst it is extremely unlikely, we cannot guarantee that **all courses** will run.

The closing date for applications is:

• 12 September 2024 at 12 noon

Late applications will **NOT** be accepted.

We ask that you only submit one application form for the module you would like to study. If you submit more than one application, we will shortlist based on the information included in the first application. We expect to receive significant interest for our courses so please apply as soon as possible.

If you have studied with us previously, you will be required to provide your personal identification (PI) number with your application. If you are unsure of this number or need to confirm any detail from your study record, please contact our student support team by e-mailing northern-ireland@open.ac.uk

1.5 Deferred Students

If you have formally deferred a funded place and are applying to return to your module within the permitted timeframe outlined at the time of your deferral, please make an application as via the deferred application link: Skill Up: Deferred

Please note that if you are intending to take up your deferred place, you will not be eligible to apply for a further funded module to study concurrently along with the module you are returning to. An application to return to a deferred module will supersede any additional application for a further module. Additional applications will not be considered by the panel.

1.6 Registration

If you are successful in securing a place on a funded module, you will be notified by email. (Please see section 2 for key timescales for anticipated dates of notifications) The email will outline the steps you are required to complete registration and the deadlines for this process.

All applicants will be notified of outcome of decision by email.

5.0 FUNDED MODULES AND QUALIFICATION INFORMATION

5.1 Postgraduate study general information

At The Open University we offer a modular approach to learning. Our modular delivery has many benefits including bite size, stackable blocks of learning that can be built upon to suit professional and/or personal commitments across short, medium, and long - term plans, helping to make adult learning opportunities more flexible and accessible to help you fit your study around life commitments.

Each module ranges from 15 – 120 credits with most modules having 30 credits.

Credits measure the learner workload required for successful completion of a module qualification. One credit represents about 10 hours of study over the duration of the course.

We recommend that you study no more than 30 credits at any one time.

We offer the option to combine modules towards an Open University qualification, allowing you the flexibility to build your qualification from a postgraduate certificate to a Masters degree as highlighted below:

5.3 Microcredential study general information
